## Back to Church Sunday!

National “Back to Church Sunday” is September 18. Well, LUMC plans to be ahead of the wave by having our “Back to Church Sunday” on September 11! Yes, this is the historic 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 9/11. We hope it will also mark the start of something historic in the lives of those we invite to church/back to church! This Sunday marks the start of many of our Fall programs – Chancel Choir in worship, UM Youth activities, our Fall School of Christian Living, and more!

Everyone of us knows someone who is not actively connected to a local church. Perhaps they were at one time, but are no longer. Perhaps they’ve never experienced the blessing of a church family. 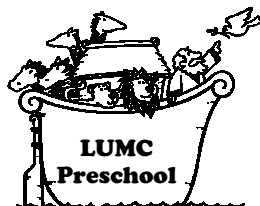

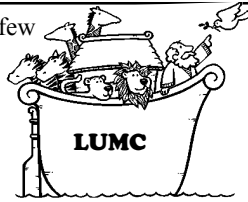

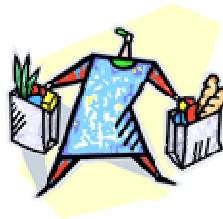


## InterFaith Shopping List:

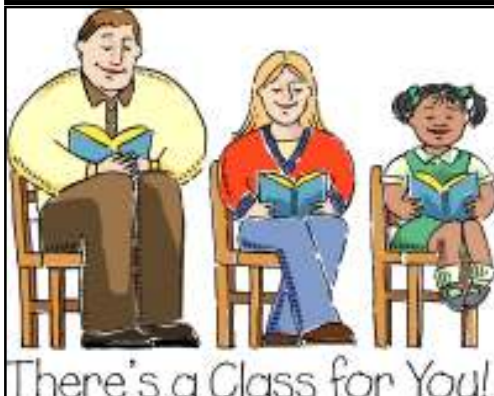

Kevin Leman writes: "Your eight- and nine-year-old kids may not be saying a lot about sex, but they're probably thinking about it. At ten and eleven, they're likely to be talking about it with their friends. Unfortunately, at twelve, thirteen and fourteen, if you haven't been involved in their lives, they may be *having sex*."

Would you prefer to be a proactive or reactive parent when it comes to your kids and their sexuality? Are you willing to rely on school to form their views on sex, marriage and family life; or would you prefer to trust the entertainment industry to impress our culture's values and views upon your child.

Maybe you don't mind the fact that their friends will pass on whatever "need-to-know" information your child is looking for regarding sexuality – and more. If you choose proactive over reactive, sit in on our discussion and hear about ways to strengthen your relationship with your child/children as you discover how to talk honestly with them about this amazing and good gift that God has given them.

We'll talk about practical approaches to presenting a healthy view of sexuality – not just the negative. You'll learn how to navigate with your child through the physical changes that take place with their bodies, and what biblical wisdom has to say (you may be surprised!) to your child, and to you. We'll discuss firsts: first bra, first shave, first period, first nocturnal emission, first school dance, first date, first kiss, and more. Perhaps the greatest gift you will receive through this is a stronger bond of openness, trust and support that will sustain your relationship with your child for the rest of life.

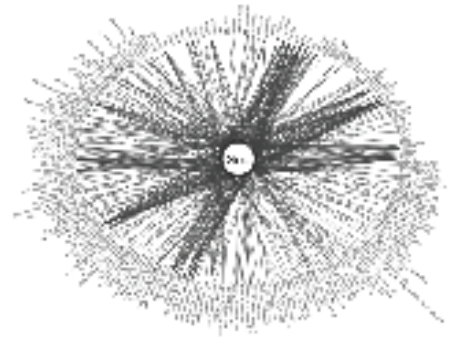

## **LUMC 2011 Christian Believer Class – Knowing God with Heart and Mind**

*"Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you who have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost. Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy? Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good, and you will delight in the richest of fare. Give ear and come to me; listen, that you may live." - Isaiah 55*



### **Listen and Give Ear**

People who hunger and thirst for God like Isaiah will find that hunger satisfied in the 2011 Christian Believer class, the goal of which is to teach people to know God through Christ with heart and mind.

### **Delight in Rich Fare**

The elliptical graphic illustrates the rich fare. God, enthroned at the center, is our feast. The inner circle of dots represents a mere 30 of His thousands of glorious attributes. The outside circle names all Bible books, and hundreds of Godly authors through the centuries. Lines connecting authors to attributes represent gourmet reading selections. Isaiah, for example, is at the 2 o'clock position. The spray of lines emanating from his name toward the center illustrate his enthusiasm for God. This enthusiasm will be shared by class participants who draw strength each week, well-fed, and hungry for more.

### **Satisfying Labor**

The labor of the 30-week course is to feast upon one Godly topic per week. The unique weekly study pattern pans through time, looking at God through Genesis on Monday, Revelations and contemporary writers on Friday, and especially through Jesus Christ and the New Testament gospels in between. Individual study requires about 30 minutes per day and 90 minutes on Sunday evenings as a class. For those who have previously taken the course, or are highly motivated, we also offer a unique new opportunity to attend, refresh, and participate in a special project using Christian books of their choice.

### **What is Good**

If we have enough participants to offer a Monday section too, couples with small children will find that a good thing is to study together during the week, attend different sections while each partner baby-sits without cost, and strengthen their marriage through their shared bond to God through Jesus Christ.

### **Live**

Topics that change our lives to center on Christ include: Believing, Revelation, Scripture, Creator, God, Providence, Covenant Maker, Humankind, Sin, Grace, Salvation, Jesus Christ, Savior, Atonement, Lord, Faith, Holy Spirit, Empowering, Trinity, Belonging, Body Of Christ, Sacrament, Worship, Discipleship, Sanctification, Christian Hope, Judgement, Resurrection, Eternal Life, Living

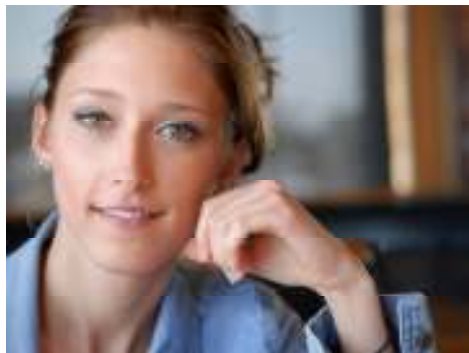

## The Library Corner

One Monday evening in late August, Leesburg church was privileged to have as its guest speaker, Alabama Bishop, William H. Willimon, former dean of the Chapel and professor of Christian ministry at Duke University. He has been named by a Baylor study as one of the 12 Most Effective Preachers in the English-Speaking World. Two of his books, written during his tenure at Duke, are among our library's holdings and are briefly described as follows.

***The Sunday After Tuesday, Colleague Pulpits Respond to 9/11***, by Willimon and Hauerwas. How appropriate to read this as we observe the tenth anniversary of September 11, 2001. These homilies and sermons, written in the context of September 11 and directed to the students who worshiped in college communities shortly afterward, attempt to relate the Christian faith to the events of the week. Willimon's sermon is among those commu-

nities represented, such as Davidson, Harvard, Southern Methodist, the U.S. Naval Academy, Baylor, Emory, Notre Dame and Stanford. Thought-provoking and highly readable! **On display (252 WIL)**

***Lord, Teach Us, The Lord's Prayer & the Christian Life***, by Willimon and Hauerwas. When the disciples asked Jesus about prayer, He said, "Pray like this. "Our Father..." The authors offer understanding of this prayer which is often said by rote on Sunday mornings. They claim that The Lord's Prayer is a lifelong act of bending our lives toward God in the way that God has offered -- "thy will be done, thy kingdom come." Phrase by phrase, The Lord's Prayer is dissected in this book so that we might have clarity on what it means to join in community and raise these petitions as Jesus instructed. Inspiring and enlightening, **Lord, Teach Us** enables us to pray this prayer and take it to heart with truer meaning. **On display (226.96 WIL)**

at McLean Bible Church in Vienna, is a worship-based service for young adults that are college age and recent college graduates. The website quotes it as “a young-adult expression of McLean Bible Church, is dedicated to providing a relevant and authentic worship experience coupled with sound biblical teaching for young adults throughout the DC Metro area.”

“Frontline” is for young adults who want to worship together and serve their community. There are several service projects throughout the year, as well as small groups to connect with and grow in faith. Frontline meets Sundays at 5:30 pm, at 8925 Leesburg Pike, Vienna. This faith based class has helped a great many people take control of their finances, instead of their finances controlling them. Through the class, participants learn how to use cash for purchases, break their dependency on debt and cut up credit cards, and name where each dollar of income must go before it is received. The videos with class discussions were designed to help individuals and families of all ages develop a logical framework for decision making when it comes to successfully handling many of the financial decisions that we face daily.

The key structure of the class is built on 7 Baby Steps:

- Save \$1,000 for an emergency fund and stop charging
- Debt Snowball – Pay off all debt but the mortgage
- Fully fund your emergency fund to 3-6 months of expenses
- Start funding your retirement
- Start saving for college
- Pay off the house
- Build wealth and Give

The class is fun, energetic, and demystifies budgeting while exposing many common myths about money. The DVD’s are informative and entertaining, the breakout groups have been lively, and we have learned of a number of success stories while watching each of us change our lives.

The FPU team started very casually, but continues to grow. Our facilitators are all graduates of the class and work hard to maintain that Gazelle Intensity (ask one of us to explain the meaning).

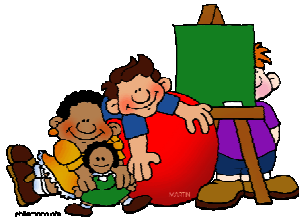

At Leesburg UMC we have 50 very active youth and they could use your support! Last year, there was an average of 28 youth attending the Gallery each week; 19 participated in the VAUMC Fall Retreats; 16 were a part of the Winter Ski Retreat; 14 joined the 30 Hour Famine; 11 became Confirmed members of the church; 32 helped to lead worship on Youth Sunday and 22 gave a week of their summer to work hard on our summer mission trip. While two of our active seniors graduated in June, we are gaining 16 new Confirmands this Fall. Our Youth Group is growing!!

Our church grows and is strengthened when our youth grow stronger in their faith, by participating in the above activities and retreats. We are offering you a new opportunity to invest in our youth program this year - We are selling Youth Group Stock! As a stockholder, you will be sent stock certificates, you will receive regular reports updating you on all youth activities, receive special offers (discounts) for our other fundraisers and in April, we will hold a special Shareholders Meeting and Banquet to present to you a full annual report.

For a Youth who participates in all of the activities offered, the cost to families is roughly \$800 per youth, less fundraisers. These costs are not included in the LUMC Budget. The average amount raised per youth in fundraising is \$86. Your investment in our youth group will help offset the high cost to families, especially with the mission trip, which costs \$350 per person. With many families having more than one child active in the youth group, sending multiple children on the mission trip or any of our retreats is often very difficult.
